NATIONAL & INTERNATIONAL EVENTS LISTED

HSUM

- An annual event held 1995-2000 and 2004-present, the Nike Hoop Summit features a USA Junior National Select Team comprised of the top high school seniors pitted against an International Select Team. The series now stands at 12-5 in favor of the USA, which won in 1995, 1997, 1999-2000, 2004-08, 2010-11 and 2014.

U19

- Originally known as the FIBA Junior World Championship, the tournament was held every four years between 1979-2007. FIBA now conducts the U19 World Championship every two years. USA men's teams are 78-13 in the U19/Junior World Championships and have won five gold and three silver medals, most recently finishing with a perfect 9-0 record and in possession of the gold medal in 2013.
- *2013 FIBA U19 World Championship:* Played in Prague, Czech Republic, the youngest, yet most internationally experienced team USA Basketball had fielded at this event, bested all comers by an average scoring margin of +39.6 points a game. **Aaron Gordon**, who checked in to average team-highs of 12.6 ppg. and 6.2 rpg., earned U19 MVP honors, while **Jahlil Okafor** was named to the five-member all-tournament team after posting 10.8 ppg. off the bench.
- *2011 FIBA U19 World Championship:* The USA's attempt to repeat as FIBA U19 World Champions fell short in Latvia, however, the Americans defeated both the gold and silver medalists, and while finishing fifth, tied for the best overall record with a 7-2 win-loss record. **Jeremy Lamb**, who paced the USA squad with 16.3 ppg., was named to the five-member all-tournament team.

U18

- Originally known as the FIBA Americas Junior World Championship Qualifier, the tournament was held every four years between 1990-2006. FIBA changed its calendar following the 2006 championship, and the tournament is now conducted every other year, followed in the next summer by the FIBA U19 World Championship. USA men's teams are 43-2 in the U18 / Junior World Championship Qualifiers and have won six golds and two bronze medals.
- *2014 FIBA Americas U18 Championship:* Hosted by USA Basketball in Colorado Springs, Colorado, the USA claimed gold for the seventh time in nine FIBA Americas Championships. Tournament MVP **Stanley Johnson** averaged a team-best 14.0 ppg. and added 5.4 rpg.
- *2012 FIBA Americas U18 Championship:* Held in Sao Sebastião do Paraíso, Brazil, the USA men claimed gold. **Julius Randle**, the USA's youngest player, averaged team-highs of 14.2 ppg and 6.6 rpg.
- *2010 FIBA Americas U18 Championship:* The USA rolled through its first four games in San Antonio, Texas, before pushing through a strong Brazilian team to claim gold.

U17

- FIBA launched the U17 World Championship, a biennial tournament, in 2010 and the USA has swept the competition for three-straight gold medals for a 23-0 record at the event.
- In 2014 **Malik Newman** was named tournament MVP after leading the USA to a perfect 7-0 mark and the gold. Newman was joined on the all-tournament team by **Diamond Stone**.
- In 2012 Okafor earned MVP honors and was joined on the all-tournament team by **Justise Winslow** as the U.S. rolled up a perfect 8-0 slate en route to gold.
- 2010 was the inaugural FIBA U17 World Championship for Men. The USA captured gold with a perfect 8-0 record and **Brad Beal** was tabbed MVP.

U16

- A qualifying tournament for the FIBA U17 World Championship, the inaugural FIBA Americas U16 Championship, which features eight teams from the Americas and Caribbean was held in 2009. The USA has won all three U16s and owns a perfect 15-0 mark at the event.
- The 2013 USA U16s scorched all comers by a record-setting 53.4-point margin of victory as **Malik Newman** was named MVP after averaging team-highs of 16.2 ppg. and 2.8 spg.
- The 2011 U.S. U16 squad topped opponents by an average margin of 42.2 ppg. en route to a perfect 5-0 mark and the gold medal as **Jabari Parker** was named MVP.
- The 2009 USA U16 National Team scored an average of 113.0 points a game and won its five games by an average of 33.8 ppg. to claim the competition's first gold medal.

WUG

- The World University Games are held every other year and are organized by the International University Sports Federation (FISU). The World University Games is a multi-sport competition open to men and women who are between the ages of 17 and 24, and are or have been within the past year, a student at a college or university. The United States has claimed 19 medals in the World University Games since beginning play in 1965, and has captured a record 13 golds, three silvers and three bronze medals in the 21 WUGs in which a USA Basketball squad has competed. The USA owns a 144-11 won-loss record in World University Games play.
- The 2011 USA squad finished with a 7-1 record and in fifth place, while the 2013 team finished ninth with a 6-2 mark.

3x3 & YOG

- The Youth Olympic Games were first held in 2010, and are scheduled to be held every four years and played under FIBA's 3x3 rules. FIBA launched its U18 3x3 World Championship in 2011 and holds the competition annually, with the exception of Youth Olympic Games years. The USA did not compete in the 2014 YOGs, while the 2010 USA YOG Team finished fourth. The 2011 USA U18 3x3 World Championship Team finished in eighth place, in 2012 the U.S. squad captured the silver medal and the 2013 team finished in ninth place.

UNIVERSITY OF ARIZONA

Did You Know? While the University of Arizona has a rich history with USA Basketball, **Richard Jefferson** became Arizona's first Olympian after starting for the 2004 U.S. Men's Olympic Team that finished with the bronze medal in Athens. Eight years later **Andre Igoudala**, who helped USA Basketball earn gold at the 2010 FIBA World Championship, became Arizona's second Olympian and captured a gold medal in London as a member of the 2012 U.S. Olympic Team. **Gilbert Arenas** was a finalist for the 2006 USA World Championship Team and played in the squad's first four exhibition games before suffering a groin strain that forced him out of contention for the Worlds. In 2003 **Mike Bibby** and Jefferson were members of the 2003 USA Men's Olympic Qualifying Team that captured the gold medal and qualified the U.S. for the 2004 Athens Olympics. Additionally, over the years, Arizona has produced some standout players for USA Basketball. Included in that group are **Sean Elliott** and **Steve Kerr**, both of whom competed under former Arizona head coach **Lute Olson** on the gold medal winning 1986 USA Basketball Men's World Championship and USA Goodwill Games teams. Also, **Jason Terry** helped the 2001 USA Goodwill Games Team capture the gold medal in Australia. Recent Arizona standout **Aaron Gordon** won a pair of gold medals playing for USA Basketball, including the 2013 FIBA U19 World Championship, where he was named MVP, and earned 2013 USA Basketball Male Athlete of the Year honors. Last summer, Arizona head coach **Sean Miller** was on the sideline as an assistant coach for the USA squad that posted a 5-0 record en route to the 2014 FIBA Americas U18 Championship gold medal and a berth in the 2015 FIBA U19 World Championship.

- Member of the 2012 USA U17 World Championship Team that earned a perfect 8-0 record en route to capturing the gold medal at the 2012 FIBA U17 World Championship in Kaunas, Lithuania. Started six of eight games and averaged 7.8 ppg. and 4.9 rpg.
- Started the first two games for the 2011 USA U16 National Team before being sidelined with a fracture-dislocation of his left second metacarpal early in the second contest at the 2011 FIBA Americas U16 Championship, in which the USA captured the gold medal with a 5-0 mark in Cancun, Mexico.

UNIVERSITY OF ARKANSAS

Did You Know? Including **Joe Kleine**, a member of the 1982 silver medal winning USA World Championship Team and the 1984 gold medal winning U.S. Olympic Team, the University of Arkansas boasts of three U.S. Olympians and five USA World Championship Team members on its all-time roster. In addition to Kleine, **R.C. Pitts** (1948) and **Alvin Robertson** (1984) also earned gold at the Olympics; while **Todd Day** and **Lee Mayberry** collected the bronze at the 1990 World Championship and silver at the 1990 Goodwill Games; and **Marvin Delph** was a member of the 1978 USA World Championship Team that finished in fifth place. More recently **Joe Johnson**, a silver medalist on the 2000 USA U21 World Championship Qualifying Team and a member of the 2006-08 USA Basketball Men's Senior National Team, aided the U.S. in 2006 to the World Championship bronze medal. Overall, the team posted an 8-1 slate at the Worlds and 5-0 in exhibition play. Kleine twice returned to USA Basketball as a coach. He served as an assistant to the 2003 USA Youth Development Festival South Team that captured the gold medal and assisted with the 2004 USA Junior National Select Team that defeated the World Select Team 99-79 in the '04 Nike Hoop Summit.

- Scored four points in the 2013 Nike Hoop Summit for the 2013 USA Junior National Select Team that fell to the 2013 World Select Team 112-98 in Portland, Oregon.

BOSTON COLLEGE

Did You Know? **Troy Bell** helped the U.S. earn gold at the World Championship For Young Men in Saitama, Japan. Former BC standout **Bill Curley** also helped the United States earn gold at the 1993 World Championship For Young Men (later renamed the U21 World Championship), and **John Austin** (1965) and **John Bagley** (1981) collected gold for the USA at the World University Games. Also, in the third Pan American Games **Bill Evans** aided the 1959 USA team to a gold medal. In 2005 a pair of Eagles donned a USA Basketball jersey. **Jared Dudley** tried out for the USA U21 World Championship Team, and while he didn't make the final cut, Dudley was one of 16 finalists and played in the USA's first game of the 2005 Global Games against Ukraine in Dallas, Texas. **Craig Smith** was the USA's second leading scorer as the 2005 USA World University Games Team posted a 8-0 record and won the gold medal in Izmir, Turkey.

K.C. Caudill

- Member of the 2010 USA Youth Olympic Games Team that competed in the first Youth Olympic Games, which was the first major international event played under FIBA's 3x3 rules, and finished in fourth place with a 5-2 record in Singapore.

BRIGHAM YOUNG UNIVERSITY

Did You Know? Tyler Haws became the fourth BYU athlete to compete for USA Basketball in the World University Games, following Devin Durrant (1983, bronze), Craig Raymond (1967, gold) and Fred Roberts (1981, gold). Additionally, Roberts helped the U.S. capture the inaugural FIBA Junior World Championship gold medal in 1979, while Mike Smith was a member of the 1983 USA Junior World Championship Team that won gold. While he didn't compete internationally for USA Basketball, Jimmer Fredette was a member of the 2010 USA Basketball Men's Select Team that trained in Las Vegas, Nev., against the 2010 USA Men's National Team, which was preparing for the 2010 FIBA World Championship.

- Member of the 2013 USA World University Games Team that finished in ninth place with a 6-2 record at the 2013 World University Games in Kazan, Russia.

UNIVERSITY AT BUFFALO

Did You Know? Buffalo head coach Bobby Hurley played on four USA Basketball teams. He earned silver medals at the 1989 U.S. Olympic Festival and 1990 Goodwill Games before striking gold at the 1991 World University Games. Hurley then was a member of the the 1992 Developmental National Team that trained against the 1992 U.S. Olympic Team.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA

Did You Know? While numerous Cal athletes have competed for USA Basketball on the junior level, five captured gold or silver medals playing in the Olympics or FIBA World Championships. Most notable is Jason Kidd, who never lost a game as a member of the USA National Team and captured Olympic gold in 2000 and 2008 and FIBA Americas Championship/Tournament of the Americas gold in 1999, 2003 and 2007. Shareef Abdur-Rahim teamed with Kidd on the 2000 U.S. Olympic Team and also won a gold at the 1994 Junior World Championship Qualifying Tournament, Hank D'Antonio earned a silver medal on the 1959 USA World Championship Team, Darrall Imhoff was a member of the 1960 U.S. Olympic Team that won gold and Kevin Johnson captured gold at the 1994 FIBA World Championship. Further, former Cal head coach Pete Newell served as head coach for the 1960 U.S. Olympic Team that captured the gold medal. Ryan Anderson took a step toward representing USA Basketball internationally after participating in the 2013 USA National Team mini-camp in Las Vegas.

CLEVELAND STATE UNIVERSITY

Did You Know? It is believed that **DeMonte Flannigan**, who has competed in three 3x3 international tournaments while donning the red, white and blue USA jersey, is the first Cleveland State athlete to represent USA Basketball in international competition. However, former Cleveland State head coach **John McLendon** was a scout for the 1974 USA World Championship Team, which was led by Luther Burden and John Lucas. The USA finished in a three way tie for first place with the Soviet Union and Yugoslavia, all three had identical 6-1 records, but the U.S. finished third and in possession of the bronze medal due to FIBA's tie-breaking formula.

Burdette Haldorson and **Robert Jeangerard** teamed up to help the 1956 U.S. Olympic Team capture gold in Melbourne, Australia, and four years later Haldorson became the second player in history to claim two men's basketball Olympic gold medals when he repeated the feat in Rome. **Les Metzger** (1950) and Jeangerard (1959) returned home with FIBA World Championship silver medals, while **Chauncey Billups**, who first played for USA Basketball in 1995, captured gold with the 2010 USA World Championship Team and was among the finalists for the 2012 U.S. Olympic Team before being sidelined with an injury. In addition to his 2010 FIBA World Championship gold medal, Billups won gold as a member of the 1995 U.S. Olympic Festival North Team, was a member of the 1996 USA Select Team that fell 96-90 to the 1996 USA National Team in a pre-Olympic exhibition contest, and won gold at the 2007 FIBA Americas Championship to help USA Basketball qualify for the 2008 Olympic Games. Further, Billups currently is a member of the USA Basketball Board of Directors. Also, CU head coach **Tad Boyle** served as a court coach at the 2013 USA Men's World University Games Team training camp and **Spencer Dinwiddie** was a member of the 2013 USA World University Games Team.

Did You Know? Numerous players from the University of Connecticut have honed their skills during the summer with USA Basketball. For instance, 2000 Olympic gold medalist **Ray Allen** was named to the all-tournament team at the 1994 U.S. Olympic Festival and then helped the 1995 USA Men's World University Games Team post a 7-0 record and win the gold medal. For his efforts, Allen was tabbed the 1995 USA Basketball Male Athlete of the Year. UConn's most recent Olympian, **Emeka Okafor**, was on the 2004 squad that finished with the bronze medal in Athens. He and teammate **Ben Gordon** were also on the 2003 USA Pan American Games Team. In 1990 **Chris Smith** was a member of the bronze medal winning USA World Championship and silver medal winning USA Goodwill Games squads. **Richard Hamilton** was one of just four collegians -- along with Mateen Cleaves and Trajan Langdon -- to participate in trials for the 1998 USA Basketball Men's World Championship Team and went on to be selected to the 1999 USA Basketball Tournament of the Americas Team that posted a 10-0 record and qualified the United States for the 2000 Olympic Games. Additionally, **Khalid El-Amin** was a member of the gold medal winning 1998 USA Goodwill Games Team; **Kevin Freeman** competed for the gold medal winning 1999 USA World University Games Team; and **Caron Butler** was a member of the 2001 USA World Championship For Young Men Team that earned an 8-0 record en route to the gold medal. **Rudy Gay** and **Marcus Williams** helped the 2005 USA U21 World Championship Qualifying Team earn an overall record of 11-1 after finishing fifth with a 7-1 slate at the 2005 FIBA U21 World Championship and a 4-0 mark for the gold medal at the 2005 Global Games. Did You Know? Davidson's two-time All-American **Fred Hetzel** averaged a team second best 12.9 ppg. as member of the first USA World University Games Team in 1965. That squad set the standard for the United States in World University Games action, collecting a perfect 8-0 record en route to the gold medal. The U.S. in World University Games action now has earned a total of 12 golds, three silvers and two bronze medals, boasting a 117-7 overall record in 17 WUGs. Additionally, **Terry Holland**, who rolled up a 92-43 (.681) record in five years (1969-70 to 1973-74) at the helm of Davidson, served as the chair of the USA Basketball Men's Collegiate Committee from 1996-2004. The Committee selected players and coaches for USA Basketball teams competing in events such as the FIBA World Championship For Young Men, FIBA Junior World Championship, Pan American Games and World University Games, among others.

More recently **Stephen Curry** helped the USA earn gold medals with a combined perfect 18-0 record at the 2010 and 2014 FIBA Basketball World Cups. A member of the USA Basketball Men's National Team since 2010, Curry also earned a silver medal at the 2007 FIBA U19 World Championship.

DUKE UNIVERSITY

Did You Know? Duke University has had fabled success with USA Basketball, having players compete in all major USA Basketball competitions, including the Olympics, World Championship, World Championship For Young Men (U21), U19/Junior World Championship, U17 World Championship, Pan American Games, Goodwill Games and World University Games.

Duke is the only school to claim five USA Basketball Male Athletes of the Year, including **Elton Brand** (1998), **Chris Duhon** (2001), **Christian Laettner** (1991 and 1992 as a member of the '92 Olympic Team, which earned the award as a group), **Jabari Parker** (2011) and **Shelden Williams** (2005).

Making his first appearance on a USA bench in 1979, Duke's Hall of Fame coach **Mike Krzyzewski** has manned the sidelines for the United States off and on for 35 years now. Since 1979 he has been involved as a coach with 14 USA teams and has helped lead the U.S. to 10 gold medals, two silver medals and two bronze medals. Krzyzewski is the only USA Basketball men's coach to have won gold at the Olympics and the FIBA World Championship/World Cup, while also possessing an NCAA Championship. In 2012 he became only the second coach to lead teams to back-to-back Olympic gold medals (Henry Iba won the Olympics in 1964 and 1968). His efforts have been so noteworthy that he has been selected USA Basketball's National Coach of the Year a record five times (2006, 2007, 2008, 2010 and 2012).

Olympic gold medalists **Mike Armstrong** (1976), **Grant Hill** (1996), Laettner (1992) and **Jeff Mullins** (1964); two-time Olympian **Carlos Boozer**, who earned gold in 2008 and bronze in 2004; and USA World Championship Team members **Tommy Amaker** (1986 / gold), **Shane Battier** (2006 / bronze), Brand (2002, 2006 / bronze), **Kyrie Irving** (2014 / gold) Laettner (1990 / bronze), **Trajan Langdon** (1998 / bronze), **Mason Plumlee** (2014 / gold) and **Jay Williams** (2002) all hailed from Duke. Further, Irving, who was a member of the 2012 USA USA Select Team that trained against the 2012 USA National Team prior to the Olympics, was named MVP of the 2014 FIBA Basketball World Cup after helping lead the USA to gold in Spain.

Former Duke student-athlete and assistant coach **Steve Wojciechowski** was a member of both the gold medal winning 1994 USA Junior World Championship Qualifying Team and the 1995 USA Junior World Championship Team that finished in fifth place. Wojciechowski also was involved with the USA Men's National Team from 2005-12, assisting the coaching staff in on-court drills, scouting and other game preparations. **Jeff Capel**, while coaching at VCU, was an assistant for the 2005 USA World University Games Team that captured gold and while at University of Oklahoma headed up the gold medal winning 2010 USA U18 National Team. When Capel was still in high school he participated on the 1993 U.S. Olympic Festival South Team that earned the bronze medal. This past year Capel served as a staff assistant for the 2014 USA Men's National and World Cup teams, aiding the coaches in on-court drills and scouting as the U.S. squad rolled up a 4-0 exhibition record and a 9-0 slate en route to gold at the FIBA Basketball World Cup.

Among the numerous Duke athletes to compete for USA Basketball through the years on the junior level are **Seth Curry**, who helped the 2009 USA U19 World Championship Team capture the USA's first gold medal at that event in 18 years, and **Rasheed Sulaimon**, who replicated the U19 golden finish in 2013.

Also competing on a USA Worlds squad, **Derrick Jackson** was a member of the 1978 USA World Championship Team that finished in fifth place. More recently, **Deron Williams** was on a trio of USA Basketball junior teams and won gold in helping the 2007 USA National Team qualify for the 2008 Olympics, before becoming a two-time Olympic gold medalist (2008, 2012). **Tal Brody** was on a pair of USA World Championship squads, 1967 and 1970; **Kiwane Garris** (1998) and **Rick Schmidt** (1974) both earned bronze medals as members of USA World Championship teams; **George BonSalle** helped the 1959 USA Pan American Games Team to a gold medal; and **Cory Bradford** (1999), **Jerry Hester** (1997) and **Craig Tucker** (1979) were members of gold medal winning USA World University Games teams. **Brian Cook** was a member of the 2001 USA World Championship For Young Men Team that earned an 8-0 record en route to the gold medal in Saitama, Japan, as well as the 2000 USA World Championship For Young Men Qualifying Team that finished 4-1 and won the silver medal in Ribeirao Preto, Brazil. Also, **Dee Brown** was a member of the 2002 and 2003 USA Junior National Teams and won a gold medal at the '02 Junior World Championship Qualifying Tournament and **Meyers Leonard** played on the 2011 USA U19 World Championship Team. Another former Illini with USA Basketball ties is **Jerry Colangelo**, current USA Basketball chairman of the board since 2009 and USA Men's National Team managing director since 2005. Included in KU's 11 are players from the 1948 (**Gordon Carpenter**), 1952 (**Charles Hoag, William Houglund, John Keller, Melvin Kelley, Robert Kenney, William Lienhard and Clyde Lovellette**), 1956 (Houglund), 1960 (**Allen Kelley**), 1968 (**Joseph 'Jo Jo' White**), 1980 (**Darnell Valentine**) and 1988 (**Danny Manning**) U.S. Olympic squads. In addition, legendary KU coach **Phog Allen** served as an assistant coach on the 1952 U.S. Olympic Team, former KU athletic director **Arthur Lonborg** served as manager for the 1960 U.S. Olympic Team; while former KU head coach **Larry Brown**, a player on the 1964 U.S. Olympic Team, was an assistant coach on the 1980 and 2000 U.S. Olympic teams and was the head coach for the 1999 and 2003 USA Tournament of the Americas Teams that earned a gold medal and qualified the U.S. for the 2000 and 2004 Games. In 2004 Brown continued his Olympic legacy as the head coach of the 2004 U.S. Olympic bronze medal winning squad, and one of his assistants was former KU head coach **Roy Williams**, who also assisted Brown and the USA to a gold medal at an Olympic berth in the 2003 FIBA Americas Olympic Qualifying Tournament. Also, Manning earned 1987 USA Basketball Male Athlete of the Year honors for his play at the World University Games.

Kansas also boasts five USA World Championship Team members. Most recent among the quad is **Kirk Hinrich**, who helped the U.S. to the bronze medal with an 8-1 slate at the '06 Worlds. Did You Know? Oklahoma lists four U.S. Olympic gold medalists on its all-time roster. **Marcus Freiburger** and **Wayne Glasgow** teamed up in 1952 to help propel the U.S. Olympic Team to an 8-0 record and the gold medal, **Lester Lane** earned gold at the 1960 Olympics with a perfect 8-0 mark, and **Wayman Tisdale** went 8-0 and claimed gold at the 1984 Olympic Games. Tisdale also earned golds at the 1983 Pan American Games and the 1982 U.S. Olympic Festival. **Corey Brewer** did double duty in 1997. He and the USA finished fifth with a 6-2 record at the FIBA U21 World Championship and shortly after returning home, he joined the USA World University Games Team, with which he captured gold. **Alvan Adams** earned a gold medal at the 1973 World University Games, **De'Angelo Alexander** and the 2003 USA U19 World Championship Team finished in fifth place with a 7-1 record, **Taj Gray** finished in fifth place with a 7-1 record at the 2005 FIBA U21 World Championship, **Kermit Holmes** (1997 / gold), **Anthony Martin** (1993 / gold) and **Aaron McGhee** (2005 / fourth place) all competed on USA World Championship Qualifying teams, while **Jeff Webster** earned gold at the 1993 World University Games. In 2012 **Blake Griffin** was named to the U.S. Olympic Team, but was injured and withdrew from the squad.

Oklahoma head coach **Lon Kruger** has been on the staff of four USA Basketball teams, most notably as an assistant coach for Rudy Tomjanovich and the 1998 USA World Championship Team that finished with a 7-2 record and came within three points of playing for the gold medal, but returned from Athens with the bronze. What made the podium finish so remarkable was the way the team was assembled, came together and amazed the basketball world with its play. With NBA labor problems preventing the use of NBA players as was done in 1994, USA Basketball began assembling a new team just three weeks out from the opening of training, looking to players who had played professionally overseas, in the CBA or in college. Many thought the team wouldn't make it out of the preliminary rounds, but after going 3-0 in exhibition play against France, Spain and Italy, people started to take notice. While the team wasn't dominating its opponents, Tomjanovich, Kruger and the rest of the staff made sure the American men were prepared for each game. The USA's two losses came at a total of four points -- 84-82 versus Lithuania in the preliminary round and 66-64 to Russia in the semifinal game. Despite the heartbreaking semifinal loss, the Americans rallied and downed host Greece 84-61 for the bronze medal.

In 1994, then-Providence head coach Pete Gillen was an assistant coach for the USA World Championship Team that captured gold. As far as playing for USA Basketball, Providence has had one alum compete in the FIBA World Championship, **Vincent Ernst**, who in 1963 was on the USA World Championship Team that finished with a 3-3 record and in fourth place. Earlier that summer, however, Ernst aided the USA to a 6-0 mark and gold medal at the Pan American Games. **Joe Hassett** also captured gold at the Pan Ams, with his coming in 1975. Another old-timer, **Dick Welsh**, was the first Trojan to represent the U.S. in FIBA World Championship play. He and the 1959 USA Men's World Championship Team compiled a 4-2 record and came home with the silver medal. The second Trojan to compete at a FIBA Basketball World Cup (formerly the FIBA World Championship) was **DeMar DeRozen**, who aided the 2014 USA team to a perfect 9-0 record and the gold medal.

Additionally, **Paul Westphal** was on the '71 USA Pan American Games Team and **Maurice Williams** won a gold medal at the first FIBA Junior World Championship in 1979. In more recent years, **O.J. Mayo**, who first joined a USA Basketball team at the 2004 Youth Development Festival, played on the 2007 USA Junior National Select Team, was a member of the 2008 and 2009 USA Select Teams that trained against the USA Men's National Team and was on the 2010-12 USA Men's National Team

The summer of '98 also saw another Xavier athlete star for USA Basketball. **James Posey** helped the 1998 USA Goodwill Games Team, a squad comprised of collegians playing against seasoned international veterans, capture the gold medal.
